This Reception is a wonderful way to continue to share with the Communities what Family & Friends is all about!

There was a Pink Day Challenge again, between the 2 schools where our amazing kids raised \$2391 for the Breast Cancer Awareness Fund. Yay for kids & pinkness!

Churchbridge in Bloom...

Churchbridge residents & tourists have enjoyed the beauty of the seeds that were planted to join Communities in Bloom in 2002, as part of a National and Provincial organization wherein they were involved in developing beautification of the Town of Churchbridge. This included yearly evaluation. In 2008, the name was changed to Churchbridge in Bloom as the organization chose to function independently.

Throughout these years the Memorial Park has been developed; flowers & trees to enjoy in the summer and the Nativity Scene and lights set up in the Christmas season. Hanging floral baskets decorate the downtown streets as well as planted flower pots and perennial beds throughout the town.

Dedicated seniors volunteer their time every summer to plant, water, weed and upgrade their designated area. A golf cart with an installed water tank is used for watering. Town summer students help with the watering and mowing of the Memorial Park.

Look where we have come from... Look what we have done...

What Our Foundation is:

Family & Friends Foundation is a non-profit corporation with charitable status serving the Communities, Towns & RMs of Spy Hill, Langenburg & Churchbridge...dedicated to building charitable causes in our communities. Donations are tax deductible.

We are 12 years old...In 2003, when the foundation was incorporated, we were the 4th Community Foundation in Saskatchewan.

Our Foundation is really all about three roles.

1. The first role is building flow through funds & endowment funds...

It actually means that the fund itself is never spent. The investment income or interest earned from the fund may then be granted based on qualifications outlined and answered in the Grant Application. The Family & Friends Foundation recommends \$5000 contribution in donations to create a new endowment fund within the foundation. The funds are held in perpetuity...meaning forever.

When a fund is established it is designated as to how the grant money (interest) from that fund will be accessed or 'ear marked' for.

2. The second is to provide grants to charities. Since 2003 close to 1million dollars has been granted within the three communities of Spy Hill, Churchbridge and Langenburg.

3. The third role is to provide community leadership which happens by encouraging & leading citizens of all ages to participate in community life by both volunteering and donating.

A volunteer board of 10 board members, a financial administrator & a program administrator govern Family & Friends. The Board is paid absolutely nothing (even pay for their own lunches etc for meetings & mileage) while the Program Administrator & the Financial Administrator receive a small honorarium yearly.

Our members are non profit organizations from the communities & they apply for grants.

How we got Started...

A local lawyer saw a need in our community because a great deal of local money was leaving & going to TV promoted Church Organizations & a variety of other charitable causes. In speaking with business members, local Town Councilors & RM Councilors they observed that there were many needs locally that were not being addressed by these Charities & the decision was made to get educated on the process of establishing a non profit foundation locally.

They formed a Steering Committee of approximately 8 members & spoke with other Foundation Boards to research what was required. (The Steering Committee received a lot of education from the Kilarney Foundation).

The decision was made to have our Foundation encompass the Towns. Communities & RMs of Langenburg, Spy Hill & Churchbridge, because without it being a joint effort it would be difficult to have enough donations come in to make it viable.

The RMs & towns contributed seed money which resulted in the Town Designated Funds.

Other Founding Members contributed as well:

Bronze: \$500 - \$1000

Silver: \$1000 - \$5000

Gold: \$5000

Once we had a plan & knew the Founding Members were 'on board' we made the decision to incorporate as a non profit organization with charitable status.

In the beginning we established several committees to help generate enthusiasm, get people involved and also to get the word out in our communities as to what we were all about & how all could benefit.

All of our grants stay in our communities. (or are granted to equipment or a facility that our communities use...example CT Scanner & mammogram machine - without these in Yorkton we all have to travel to Regina or Saskatoon).

Each Community stands on it's own in giving & receiving. Example: If Dog River contributes way more to their Community Fund than Wullerton, then they have more grant money to access.

New Putland Fund...

Diann (Kitsch) and Denis Putland were both born and raised in the area. Their family hog and grain farm was located near Churchbridge. They were married in 1964 and were blessed with two married children Roslyn (John) Bourak and Ross (Tammy) Putland and were very proud of one grandson Jordan.

Diann was known to everyone as the "lily Lady" her love of gardening and flowers was nurtured by her mother in law, Vera Putland. Diann had a successful online and catalogue lily business.

Diann always had a large vegetable garden, perennial beds, rose garden and an apple orchard.

Both Denis and Diann were very active in the Lutheran church and the community. Diann was a member of local, regional and provincial horticultural societies. She provided flowers for many occasions, frequently to care homes and church.

They both Loved to visit with friends and family and spent many days traveling in their RV . To continue their legacy of caring for others and their community, after Diann passed away Denis decided to bequeath \$20,000.00 to the Family and Friends Community Foundation the interest each year to will be shared by the Churchbridge Communities in Bloom and the Churchbridge Cemetery.
